The incidence of death and disease in a community provides the general framework against which to assess community health status. A community's success in promoting healthy living is reflected in statistical data related to mortality and morbidity, and the extent to which those rates meet or exceed established goals for healthy living.

Crude death rates measure the frequency of deaths within a specific population and are calculated for a given time, interval, and place. Crude death rates are important in analyzing cause of death within a specific area, but they are a poor comparison tool because they do not take population variables into consideration. The weakness of crude death rates is most notable in populations with a large elderly contingent, where the rate of death may be high but the health status of the community is relatively good.

Age-adjusted death rates provide the greatest insight to health status differences between communities. Age-adjusted death rates represent a summary rate for cause of death and permit an unbiased comparison of death regardless of age differences.





Community Health Comparisons

In general, Pasco County residents die more frequently than their peers at the State level. Unintentional Injury deaths are 51% higher in Pasco County. Deaths from Chronic Obstructive Respiratory Disease are 41% higher than the State rate; Diabetes deaths are almost 22% higher than the State rate; and Cancer deaths are 11% higher than the State rate.
